Veteran Handicapper Alan Hampton Wins Las Vegas Challenge, Praises Assiniboia Downs

Former Handicapper of the Year Alan Hampton demonstrated his expertise once again by winning the final Las Vegas Challenge Handicapping Tournament of the year at Assiniboia Downs. His victory netted him \$3,500 and lifted him into second place in the Handicapper of the Year Standings.

Hampton secured the win with a final bankroll of \$104.00, edging out Bruce Barkwell (\$101.70) by a mere \$2.30, followed by Ken Stewin (\$97.00), Randy Premachuk (\$96.00) and Bill Siwak (\$95.50). His triumph was particularly noteworthy as he achieved it without selecting Adam's Creed, the longest-priced winner of the day on Monday at \$63.30, which seven of his rivals, including Barkwell, Stewin, and Premachuk, had chosen.

Hampton's journey into horse racing began in his teenage years. "Ever since I was a kid, I was interested in animals, and horses were one of my favourites," he recalled. "I got my parents to take me to the track. I think I was 14 or 15. I had to have somebody take me. I couldn't bet."

Hampton was immediately captivated. His early fascination evolved into a lifelong passion, and as soon as he could drive, he became a regular at the track. He invested in third-floor box seats and later had his own seat with his name on it in the clubhouse, right behind Phil Kives' box.

When it comes to picking winners, Hampton's approach is multifaceted. As a former accountant, he naturally gravitates towards numbers. "I was always a numbers guy," he explained. However, his method goes beyond mere statistics. Hampton emphasizes the importance of understanding a horse's lineage and past performances. "I took an interest in the lineage of the horses and just, well, trying to figure it out," he said.

One of Hampton's key strategies is to be a forgiving bettor. He advises not to jump ship too quickly if a horse disappoints. "If you get really high on a horse and it lets you down... remember. There was a reason you had a strong feeling. So trust in yourself," he said. Hampton also pays close attention to track conditions and biases. "I think the biggest mystery left to me now when I think about it is the track bias and how it can shift," he mused. He noted how the same track can favour speed one day and closers the next, emphasizing the importance of adaptability in handicapping.

In the recent tournament, Hampton's winning strategy involved a mix of favourites and longshots spread across the card. His successful picks included House Limit (\$5.20) in the first race, Georgiano (\$49.30) in the second race, Lucky Appeal (\$8.00) in the third race, Distinct Tale (\$9.80) in the fourth race, Blue Tango (\$11.90) in the sixth race, and Gallant Oak (\$15.50) in the eighth and final race. Hampton also had two third-place finishers: Load Abroad (\$2.10) in the fifth race and Diamond Grande (\$2.20) in the seventh.

The victory wasn't sealed until the final race, where Hampton made a crucial last-minute decision to bet on Gallant Oak after carefully analyzing his most recent performance. "I watched his last race, and he finished fourth at seven furlongs against some horses that I thought were pretty darn good," Hampton explained. "It was the last second, and I decided I'm going to bet that horse." His final pick proved to be the difference-maker, pushing Hampton's bankroll just above his closest competitors.

Despite his successes, he's won this tournament three or four times before, Hampton remains humble about his achievements. He underscored the unpredictable nature of the sport and attributed his wins not just to skill, but also to luck and maintaining focus throughout the entire card.

When asked about his plans for the winnings, Hampton's response was practical and down-to-earth. "I'm getting new glasses," he said, "And I'm taking the car in for some repairs." This pragmatic approach reflects his overall philosophy towards handicapping -- it's more about the intellectual challenge and the love of the sport than big paydays.

Hampton was effusive in his praise for Assiniboia Downs, highlighting several aspects that set the track apart in his eyes. "I can't say enough good things about ASD." Hampton said. "I mean, for a small track, the fact that they've gone through all the curveballs that have been thrown at them over the years, they really should be commended. They've done a great job."

He particularly praised the track's technological advancements and user-friendly approach to presenting racing information. "When you watch it on television, the graphics and everything, it's absolutely first class." Hampton commended Assiniboia Downs for its innovative use of colour-coded silks instead of traditional owner silks, making it easier for bettors to follow the races. And he expressed appreciation for the track's commitment to keeping fans informed, even during the off-season, through their newsletter, which you're reading right now.

The handicapper's admiration extended to the track's persistence in maintaining handicapping contests, especially in light of similar events ending elsewhere. "I'm just glad that the Downs has continued this," he said "It's fun to do. Keeps the brain moving."

Hampton also noted the quality of the on-air talent at Assiniboia Downs, praising the insights provided during race coverage. "I enjoy watching those two do their show. Kirt and


Stretch... There's a lot of good-natured banter, but those boys know the horses. They say what they know. It makes sense. It's just something else to consider."

As Hampton looks ahead, he's already setting his sights on potentially reclaiming the Handicapper of the Year title. Currently in second place, he acknowledges the challenge ahead but remains optimistic. "I think I have to pull off another top three finish to maybe have any shot of doing it, but there's three more contests left."

"We're gonna try our best!"

Top NFL Picks by TravyFootball Week 5

Commanders over Browns (Sunday noon): The most exciting player in the league right now might be rookie QB Jayden Daniels. He's exceeded expectations so far and has Washington sitting atop the NFC East with a 3-1 record. He put together another masterful performance against the Cardinals going 26 of 30 for 233 yards and one touchdown while also adding another 47 yards on the ground running. It's only been four weeks, but he's got my vote for early rookie of the year. I think the Browns trade that saw them acquire




DeShaun Watson is officially a bust. Unfortunately for Cleveland, because so much guaranteed money is owed, they are pretty much stuck with him for the next few years. I don't think there has been a team more cursed at the quarterback position than the Browns and now they can add Watson to the long list of failures.

Vikings over Jets (Sunday morning): This will be the second international matchup of the season as the Vikings head overseas to face a guy that has given them headaches for the last 15 years. Before you could blink, Minnesota was out in front of the Packers 28-0 last week and then proceeded to do everything in their power to let the Packers back in it. Turnovers and poor clock management led to Green Bay storming back to make it 28-22. Despite the late push, the Vikings held on for the 31-22 victory. Aaron Rodgers has a career record of 17-11-1 against Minnesota, but after watching that mess of a game vs the Broncos last week, I highly doubt he will see his 18th victory against them. The game was so bad, the Broncos QB had completed seven of his 15 pass attempts for a whopping and unbelievable negative seven passing yards by halftime, and somehow, they still won the game. This Jets team, even with Rodgers, does not look like a team with Super Bowl aspirations.

Chiefs over Saints (Monday night): First the Chiefs lost Hollywood Brown to a preseason injury, then Isiah Pacheco, and now Rashee Rice is the latest casualty. Add to that Travis Kelce isn't quite looking like his usual self out there, and you'd think I'd be talking about a team that was 0-4, but despite all the injuries, the Chiefs are 4-0 and one of only two remaining undefeated teams. It really doesn't matter how many guys they lose, as long as Mahomes is still the quarterback, they always have a chance to win. Last week, the Saints gave up a special teams touchdown and Derek Carr also threw a pick 6, but still had the lead with one minute left in the game. But thanks to a PI penalty, it put the Falcons in range to kick the winning field goal as time expired. That's back-to-back losses for the Saints now, and they don't look anything like they did in the first few weeks of the season.

Former DRF Writer, Chart Caller, Horse Owner from Winnipeg Dies at 77



Hopeful Stakes winner and likely favourite Chancer McPatrick is one of three stakes winners in the field, which also includes talented recent maiden breaker Vekoma Rides. Forever Young, Derma Sotogake and Ushba Tesoro expected for BC Classic (G1)






