

Nine fillies and mares will vie for top spot in the \$200,000 bet365 Dance Smartly Stakes (G2T) on Saturday at Woodbine on a stellar card that also includes the Nearctic Stakes (G2T) and the Canadian International (G1). Breath Away, a multiple graded stakes-placed mare, has been listed at 6-1 for her first appearance in Canada in the Dance Smartly, which awards the winner an automatic invitation to the Pegasus World Cup Filly & Mare Turf Invitational Stakes (G2T) at Gulfstream in January.

A special Fall Turf Pick 3 with a \$5 minimum and a 15% takeout will be offered on the three turf stakes. Sounds like a fun bet to us!

2-Year-Old Stars Impress in Winnipeg Futurity and Buffalo Stakes, Bynoe and Keplin Take Big Leads Into Final Week

A pair of 2-year-olds came up with huge performances in the Winnipeg Futurity and Buffalo Stakes, and jockey Damario Bynoe scored a 4-bagger on Wednesday evening to take a 10-win lead over Antonio Whitehall into the final two days of live racing next week at ASD.

2-Year-Old Stars Impress in Winnipeg Futurity and Buffalo Stakes, Bynoe and Keplin Take Big Leads Into Final Week - Assiniboia ... Whitehall did his best to make up some ground on Bynoe on Tuesday night, scoring a hat trick to Bynoe's double, but Bynoe came back strong on Wednesday with a 4-win night to all but put the 2025 jockey title away.

Whitehall, a three-time leading rider at the Downs, can take some solace in the fact that he got the big money in the \$50,000 Winnipeg Futurity on Tuesday aboard Gary Danelson and Bonnie McCrory's Omaha Warrior for trainer Jared Brown. Whitehall gave Omaha Warrior a perfect trip, stalking a duel between favourite Wecanonlyimagine and second choice Tap the Parlay, and came with a powerful rally to take over at the sixteenth pole and draw off to win by 4 1/4-lengths over his stablemate Wecanonlyimagine, providing Brown with a 1-2 finish in the race.

A \$20,000 purchase for Danelson and McCrory at the 2024 Fasig-Tipton Kentucky Fall Yearling Sale by Brown, Omaha Warrior also won the Graduation Stakes at ASD earlier in the season. The son of Omaha Beach-Arcina by Arch improved his career record to 2-0-1 from four starts with his win in the Futurity, for earnings of US\$47,471. It was a sentimental win for Danelson, the all-time leading trainer at the Downs, who is no longer training. He's facing some health issues now at the age of 88, and it felt so good to see him in the winner's circle with a big smile.

Danelson and McCrory's big win also occurred on the National Day for Truth and Reconciliation, and all the Downs staffers wore orange shirts in a show of respect and remembrance.

Downs CEO Darren Dunn highlighted the importance of this recognition: "The participation of First Nations in our racing program is so incredibly important to Assiniboia Downs. We are so proud of the many success stories that have been created here and their contributions to the sport, which includes 10 consecutive leading trainer titles won by an indigenous person and in 2025 now tracking strongly for 11 with the near insurmountable lead that trainer Steve Keplin Jr. has."

On Wednesday evening, fans were treated to another powerhouse performance from Manitoba-bred 2-year-old Mighty Mikee in the \$40,000 Buffalo Stakes, courtesy of trainer Devon Gittens. The grey gelding by Mitole-Piccadilly Line by Air Force Blue set a fast pace early in the one-mile race and simply romped away in the stretch under no urging from jockey Shavon Belle to notch the largest winning margin of the day in North America at 17 1/4-lengths.

It was the second stakes win for Mighty Mikee, who had earlier won the CTHS Sales Stakes. Bred by Larry Falloon and owned by a partnership that includes Falloon, Anne Champion, and Mclaren Racing, Mighty Mikee was the sales topper at \$32,000 in the 2024 Manitoba CTHS Yearling Sale, and he has easily paid for himself with earnings of US\$50,974 from a record of 3-1-0 in four starts.



Browns over Vikings (Sunday morning): If only the Browns had an offense to go along with their defense, I feel like they would have won a couple more games this season. I don't know how much longer Joe Flacco is going to last as the starting QB (update, he's been benched). With him under center, Cleveland has yet to reach 20 points in any contest and they definitely struggle to move the ball downfield. It might be time to give way to one of the rookies they drafted in Dillon Gabriel or Shedeur Sanders. Their defense just

spends too much time on the field to be effective for four quarters. Having said that, Carson Wentz and the Vikings are coming to town and he is the exact type of QB that the Browns can feast on. Wentz was sacked six times by the Steelers, and their defense isn't even as good as Cleveland's is. Like I mentioned before, if the Browns plan on winning this, they have to get the offense going.

Chargers over Commanders (Sunday afternoon): Just when you thought the Chargers were going to break out into that upper echelon of teams, they laid an egg against the Giants, who were starting a rookie Quarterback. I guess the one good thing coming out of this is game is that Chargers rookie running back Omarion Hampton finally had a breakout performance, rushing for 128 yards and one touchdown. If he can keep that up, it should help alleviate some of the pressure on Justin Herbert and the passing game.

Commanders QB Jayden Daniels missed his second straight game last week against the Falcons but is expected to be back for this week 5 matchup. The bigger issue for Washington though, is there defense, having given up 58 points the last two weeks.

Jets over Cowboys Upset alert! (Sunday noon): The Cowboys unexpectedly found themselves in quite the shootout with the Green Bay Packers last week. Even after five quarters of football, it wasn't enough time to decide a win, and the very rarely seen tie game happened. I couldn't believe how easily Dak Prescott picked apart the Packers defense, and that was without Cee Dee Lamb. Now they hit the road to play a winless New York Jets. It really does take a special type of talent to be consistently bad every year like the Jets are. They can change coaches, change players, change quarterbacks, try to change the culture surrounding the team, but the more things change, the more they stay the same, and it's looking like yet another failed season. On paper, the Jets should be better than their 0-4 record, and they should be able to move the ball well against the Cowboys defense, who is probably still exhausted from last week's game.
